Pets who live outdoors need adequate shelter, FRESH (not frozen) water, and generally have increase calorie needs in the cold winter months. Long-haired breeds need to be free of matts for their undercoat to protect them properly from the frigid temperatures.

Please take some extra time to be sure that you pets are safe outside.

This system requires that your driver's license as well as phone number are

Chocolate is as tempting to them as it is for us humans! *Can you blame them?* After all, it just tastes so good. Unfortunately chocolate can be dangerous for our dogs, please call our office with any concerns or questions if your pet has eaten any chocolate.

Dogs get a taste for chocolate - they find the flavor of theobromine addictive. Even if your dog can eat small amounts of chocolate without any ill effect, don't give him a taste for it because he'll then try to sniff out and eat chocolate at every opportunity.

What are the signs of poisoning?

The symptoms of theobromine poisoning generally show within four to twenty four hours of your dog having eaten the chocolate. The early symptoms include vomiting, diarrhea, excessive thirst, increased urination and restlessness.

As time goes on, and your dog absorbs more theobromine into his system, symptoms such as lack of co-ordination, muscle twitching, hyperactivity, increased heart rate and raised blood pressure will be evident.

What do I do if my dog's eaten chocolate?

The first thing you should do is to call us and describe the symptoms your dog is showing (if any) and the type and quantity of chocolate your dog has, or you think he has, eaten.

The doctors at Creekside will need to treat your dog, but may advise you to make your dog vomit before bringing him to the hospital. Most dogs recover within 24 to 72 hours of treatment by their vet.

February is National Pet Dental Month

Proper dental care can detect dental disease that not only affects the mouth, but can also lead to more serious health problems such as heart, lung, and kidney disease. Good dental hygiene is just as important for pets as it is for humans. Yet, it is one of the most overlooked areas in pet health. Studies by the American Animal Hospital Association (AAHA) reveal that nearly two-thirds of pet owners do not provide the dental care recommended by veterinarians.

When bringing your pets into the office...

Please be sure to have all dogs on a leash with a well-fitting collar and all cats in carriers. Animals are easily scared by the sounds of a passing semi-truck and we want them to get into the building and back home safely. Please do not try to carry your cat in your arms – this can be dangerous for both animal and human.

HIGH BLOOD PRESSURE IN CATS?!

Yes! Our feline friends can suffer from high blood pressure, also known as hypertension, just as we humans do.

High blood pressure can be silent and dangerous. It can affect organs such as the eyes, kidneys, heart, and brain. Sometimes cats with other dieseases such as hyperthyroidism and kidney disease can also suffer from hypertension.

There are some signs that you can watch for in your cat that might alert us to high blood pressure. If your cat has any of the mentioned signs, their blood pressure can be checked by the veterinarian in a simliar manner to how your blood pressure is taken. It is painless to your pet.

Medication can help control hypertension and often times we can help reverse symtpoms such as sudden blindness if caught early enough. We encourage all cats over the age of 8 to get a yearly blood pressure check.



Clinical signs to look for:

Lethargy

Changes in activity or appetite

Changes in mental status

Quick onset of blindness or dilated pupils

Seizures
